

TARANAKI TOURING ROUTES

Discover Taranaki's tour routes and gain fantastic insights into the stunning mountain-to-sea region.

SURF HIGHWAY 45

The Taranaki coast is home to some of the best surf breaks in New Zealand, and Surf Highway 45 is the way to get there. But the 105km highway is home to more than just surf. The laid-back culture of coastal Taranaki has given rise to artist and artisan studios, eclectic shops and cozy cafés. Tap into the coast's many stories along the way, from the substantial Koru Pā inland from Ōakura to the Cape Egmont Lighthouse on Cape Road, while under the watchful gaze of Taranaki Maunga.

THE FORGOTTEN WORLD HIGHWAY

Tracing ancient Māori trails and pioneering farm tracks from Stratford to Taumarunui, the Forgotten World Highway is New Zealand's oldest heritage trail. Geographic, historical and scenic points of interest line the 155km route, which traverses four natural saddles and passes through the breath-taking Tāngarākau Gorge. The stories of pioneering farmers and miners are experienced through hand-hewn tunnels with the focal point of the route being the historic village of Whangamōmona, first settled in 1895 and which declared itself a republic in 1989, complete with its own presidential election.

EXPLORE THE COASTAL ARTS TRAIL

With more than 60 stops across the lower west coast of the North Island, including more than 30 stops in Taranaki, discover the unique artistic pulse of the region and the vibrant and diverse artists and galleries that call it home.

ART AND CULTURE

The near-perfect cone of Taranaki Maunga has been a recurring theme in New Zealand's art history - being painted, drawn or photographed by many of our nation's greatest artists.

The Maunga's creative influence continues to extend beyond its base, offering a journey through studios, galleries, and public art. Stratford's Percy Thomson Gallery, Fenton Arts Collective and Hāwera's Lysaght Watt Gallery cover the spectrum of the local art scene while Govett-Brewster Art Gallery/Len Lye Centre is an art museum that blends stunning architecture with cutting-edge contemporary art. The museum is home to the collection and archives of New Zealand artist Len Lye (1901-1980), whose work across film, photography and kinetic sculpture earned him international acclaim.

From the volcanic cone of Taranaki Maunga to the ancient pā sites that have marked the region's hilltops, it's hard not to get drawn into Taranaki's history, best told by one of the region's many great museums.

The best places to start are Puke Ariki, the innovative museum and library on New Plymouth's waterfront is home to exhibitions that explore the region's natural, geological and human stories; Tawhiti Museum – New Zealand's best private museum – near Hāwera, which offers an incredible journey through Taranaki's history; and Aotea Utanganui – the Museum of South Taranaki, which offers an insight into the fortunes of the region over the years.

Taranaki is also home to a wide range of eclectic collections, including the largest collection of Holden cars in the Southern Hemisphere at the Hillsborough Holden Museum, the Fun Ho! National Toy Museum and a museum dedicated to the king himself, Elvis Presley.



GREAT WALKS

Taranaki's legendary landscape offers countless opportunities to explore the outdoors, from gentle strolls to epic alpine adventures.

A great place to start is New Plymouth's Coastal Walkway, which traces the Tasman Sea from Port Taranaki to Bell Block. Along its 12.7km, the walkway passes cafés at Breakwater Bay, East End and Fitzroy, the city centre, artworks and installations, surf breaks and the stunning Te Rewa Rewa Bridge.

At the other end of the spectrum is the Pouākai Crossing, a one-day walk across the northern slopes of Taranaki Maunga over alpine wetlands, through lush native bush, and offers incredible views of the peak reflected in the Pouākai Tarn and out to the Taranaki region.

For a different type of adventure, head inland from Eltham in South Taranaki to the Rotokare Scenic Reserve. After passing through the predator-proof fence, you'll find a perfectly peaceful 4.3km walk around the rippling lake, through historically significant bush teeming with an ever-growing population of wildlife.

There truely is something for everyone, from pavement to sub-alpine forests, for all fitness levels and ages. Tracks range from 15-minute family-friendly walks to the three-tofive day around the mountain hike.

TARANAKI MUST DOS

There is no shortage of things to see and do in Taranaki, but how do you know what you simply 'must do' when you visit the region? You ask the locals!

There's so much to see and experience, everything from cruising the coast in an historic lifeboat to discovering musical talent at pop-up shows throughout the region. You could take a fantastic short walk on Taranaki Maunga, discover his story at one of the visitor centres, or pull up a seat around the fire at the Ngati Ruanui Stratford Mountain House, and stay a little longer.

Locals suggest wandering through Hāwera's King Edward Park, climbing New Plymouth's Paritutu Rock, taking a stroll through the nationally significant Pukekura Park, checking out Stratford's Glockenspiel Clock Tower, contemplating Len Lye's waterfront Wind Wand sculpture, or, the vibrant street art throughout the region. Or if its wide, open space you prefer, explore one of the many award-winning and nationally significant gardens around the region including the spectacular Pukeiti, home to one of the world's rarest collections of rhododendrons.

Be surprised by how much Taranaki has to offer, and that's before you delve into the many cafés, bars, restaurants and watering holes around the Maunga. Pick up a visitor guide from one of the region's i-SITE Visitor Information Centres to discover all of our local secrets!


The Taranaki Fringe Garden Festival showcases a remarkable collection of real gardens, designed to appeal to people from all walks of life.
